Junior Program Notes:

Patrols – Patrols are put together by the Troop and will consist of no more than 8 Scouts each. They will move around the 8 stations as a Patrol throughout the day as they complete each session. The rotation schedule will be distributed to the troop during check-in on Friday night.

Events – The events or "Stations" will be set up around camp and involve merit badge or rank advancement quality challenges. Each station will last for 50 minutes, with 10 minutes to rotate to the next station. Stations will have an individual maximum per session and once that number is reached thru registration that event will be closed. The maximum number will be set by the host of the session.

Merit Badges – The camporee will be offering 3 Merit Badges, Photography, Engineering, and Chess, as part of the junior program. These badges will be limited to the first 10 scouts that have registered and submitted payments for the weekend to the Scout Office by the registration deadline.

Session Hosts – As mentioned previously, your event should involve merit badge or rank advancement quality challenges, specifically with the younger scout in mind and take the entire time allowed. (50 minutes). Be prepared with additional tasks / challenges for the participants should your session end early and do not release the scouts prior to the 50 minute mark.

Troop Equipment – There is no specific list, however Troops will need their own equipment and food for all meals. Saturday's lunch should be a "trail lunch". Please note that the Troop is responsible for making sure their Scouts receive their lunch on Saturday during the Junior program.

Stations- First aid, fishing, fire starting, cooking, knots and lashings, compass skills, Order of the Arrow introduction, and shooting. See attachment for specific Items covered.

Each scout should come to the Jamboree prepared for a weekend of skills, competition and fun!

Senior Program Notes:

Patrols - Patrols of 5-8 Scouts compete against other patrols in the Hornets Nest District. Patrols can be a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 8. Scouts from different troops can combined to bring the patrol size up to the minimum number. Please notify the planning staff if you have fewer than 5 or more than 8 scouts.

Events – The Patrols visit eight "Villages" set up at Camp Grimes throughout the day Saturday. Each Village will present a challenge with which the Patrols respond to by using the skills they have learned. Each Village will have a theme or story and the events are geared to challenge older more experienced Scouts.

Scoring – Patrols are scored by the adult staff in the village using four criteria, Leadership, Teamwork, Scout Spirit, and Completion of Task. Patrols can earn up to 30 points at each Village.

Awards - Awards are presented at the closing campfire for 1st, 2nd, 3rd place based on total accumulated points and for the Patrol that shows the most overall "Spirit". Each Village presents a special "Village" award for the patrol that did the best or best exemplified scout spirit in their Village. Please put some planning and effort into your village award to make it something worthy of the event and can be proudly displayed.

Village Hosts – Your event should be *challenging* enough for older more experienced scouts and should take the entire time allowed. (50 minutes) If your event does not take the entire time, be prepared with additional tasks / challenges for the patrols. Events should have a theme/scenario/story to accompany the challenge and these will be reviewed with the camporee staff.

Patrol Equipment – There is no specific list. Many events will be on or near the water. (Prepare to get wet) Each Patrol should come to the Senior Camporee prepared for a weekend of skills, competition and fun. Patrols will need their own equipment and food for all meals, including a "Trail Lunch" for Saturday afternoon. Class A uniform is required for campfire and worship service.
